- 4 Oct 2023 **Addis Ababa (Ethiopia)** *Anadolu Agency*. Ethiopia and the **European Union (EU)** sign a \$680m financial support agreement for the **Multi-Annual Indicative Program** which aims to support green growth, inclusive human development, governance and peace building;
- 4 Oct 2023 **Kigali (Rwanda)** *The Africa Report.* **United States** suspends military aid to Rwanda over its alleged support for the **M23** rebel group in eastern **Democratic Republic of the Congo**;
- 4 Oct 2023 **Kigali (Rwanda)** *Africa.com.* Rwanda confirms it is building a \$53m aviation training centre with financial assistance from the **African Development Bank**, which is expected to have a positive impact on both Rwanda's aviation industry and that of the continent by offering training for up to 500 students a year;
- 3 Oct 2023 **Bujumbura (Burundi)** *The East African.* President **Evariste Ndayishimiye** reshuffles his cabinet, appointing Dr **Liduine Baradahana** as public health and fight against HIV minister, **Prosper Dodiko** as environment and agriculture minister, **Venuste Muyabaga** as civil service, labour and employment minister, and **Gervais Abayeho** as foreign affairs minister;
- 3 Oct 2023 **Kinshasa (DRC)** *Engineering News.* DRC and **Zambia** begin construction on the **Kasomeno-Mwenda Toll Road**, project which will reduce the roundtrip for commercial transporters from mining province **Haut-Katanga** (DRC) to **Tanzania**'s **Port of Dar es Salaam**;
- 3 Oct 2023 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *Daily Nation*. Cabinet orders all ministers and state departments to cut 10% of their operational budgets for the 2023/2024 financial year as part of the administration's fiscal consolidation plan;
- 3 Oct 2023 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *KBC.* Prime cabinet secretary **Musalia Mudavadi** returns from a one-day official visit to **Burundi** where he met with Burundian president **Evariste Ndayishimiye** to discuss strengthening bilateral ties;
- 3 Oct 2023 **Kigali (Rwanda)** *The East African.* **Dutch** police arrest **Pierre-Claver Karangwa**, a genocide suspect who allegedly played a key role in the genocide;
- 3 Oct 2023 **Dar es Salaam (Tanzania)** *The Citizen.* President **Samia Suluhu Hassan** carries out an administrative shuffle, making several appointments and transfers at a local government level (district commissioners and district administrative secretaries) and appoints **Musa Kuji** as acting commissioner for the conservation of the **Tanzania National Parks Authority (TANAPA)**;
- 2 Oct 2023 **Djibouti (Djibouti)** *Gulf Times.* President **Ismail Omar Guelleh** arrives in **Doha (Qatar)** to attend the **2023 Doha Horticulture Expo**;
- 2 Oct 2023 **Goma (DRC)** *La Prosperite.* A military court sentences the head of the **Republican Guard** in **Goma** to death for the killing of 57 protesters in August and awards three other commanders 10-year prison sentences;



- 2 Oct 2023 **Kinshasa (DRC)** *Monitor.* President **Felix Tshisekedi** is endorsed as the presidential candidate for the **Union Sacrée de la Nation** (sacred union of the nation) coalition, ruling out presidential competition from within the ruling coalition party;
- 2 Oct 2023 **Kinshasa (DRC)** *Al Jazeera.* **Nobel Peace Prize** winner **Denis Mukwege** announces his candidacy for upcoming presidential elections in December;
- 2 Oct 2023 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *Zawya.* Kenya joins the **Pan African Payments and Settlement System (PAPSS)**, which will allow local companies to transact with counterparts in other countries using local currencies;
- 2 Oct 2023 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *Citizen*. Government suspends all non-essential travel for government officials and imposes limits on foreign trip delegations accompanying the president, deputy president, first lady and prime cabinet secretaries;
- 2 Oct 2023 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *Citizen*. **Anne Waiguru** is elected to serve a second term as the chair of the **Council of Governors**:
- 2 Oct 2023 **Dar es Salaam (Tanzania)** *The Citizen.* Tanzania and **Zanzibar**'s finance ministries are seeking additional funding for the **Standard Gauge Railway (SGR)** project, as its main contractor, **Turkey**-headquartered **Yapi Merkezi**, is reportedly in financial distress;
- 1 Oct 2023 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *The East African*. Former defence cabinet secretary **Eugene Wamalwa** and former chief justice **Willy Mutunga** raise concern over Kenya's plans to deploy 1,000 police officers as part of a security mission to **Haiti**;
- 1 Oct 2023 **Dar es Salaam (Tanzania)** *The Citizen.* **Canadian** mining company **Montero Mining & Exploration** confirms the **International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes (ICSID)** will hear its case on 4 December in which it is claiming TSh 168 billion (\$67.06m) in damages against Tanzania over the cancellation of a retention licence for rare earth minerals at **Wigu Hill** in 2018;
- 1 Oct 2023 **Kampala (Uganda)** *Reuters.* **Uganda National Oil Company** CEO **Proscovia Nabbanja** confirms in an interview that the **Tilenga** and **Kingfisher** petroleum projects are on track for production by 2025 and that the **East African Crude Oil Pipeline (EACOP)**, which will carry oil from these fields, is also on track;
- 30 Sep 2023 **Kinshasa (DRC)** *Africanews.* **Martin Fayulu**, who came second in DRC's 2018 presidential election, confirms he will run in the presidential election scheduled for December;
- 30 Sep 2023 **Asmara (Eritrea)** *Times of Israel.* An Eritrean man is stabbed to death after a brawl in which eight others were injured in **Netanya (Israel)**. Tension between Eritrean migrants in Israel has reached new heights in recent months, with several clashes between progovernment and anti-government supporters;
- 30 Sep 2023 **Addis Ababa (Ethiopia)** *The Reporter Ethiopia*. **Tigray** officials accuse the **African Union (AU)** of walking away from the implementation of the **Pretoria Peace Agreement** which was signed on November 2022 between the **Tigray People's Liberation Front (TPLF)** and the federal government to end their conflict;
- 30 Sep 2023 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *Reuters.* **National Bureau of Statistics** reports that annual inflation reached 6.8% in September, up slightly from 6.7% in August;
- 29 Sep 2023 **Kinshasa (DRC)** *The East African.* State-owned cobalt buyer **Entreprise Générale du Cobalt (EGC)** says it is considering eight pilot sites from which it may soon start buying cobalt. EGC was given a monopoly on buying and selling artisanal cobalt to help improve working conditions in 2019 but until this announcement, has remained largely inactive;
- 29 Sep 2023 **Mogadishu (Somalia)** *VOA News.* **Kenya**, **Ethiopia**, **Burundi**, **Djibouti** and **Uganda** send a request to the **United Nations Security Council (UNSC)** to suspend a scheduled

pullout from the **African Union Transition Mission in Somalia (ATMIS)**, stating that the situation is still too fragile;

29 Sep 2023 **Dar es Salaam (Tanzania)** *Daily News.* **East African Crude Oil Pipeline (EACOP)** project coordinator **Asiafi Mrutu** reveals that Tanzania has contributed \$193.06m to the implementation of the pipeline. As a 15% shareholder, Tanzania is required to contribute a total of \$308m;

28 Sep 2023 **Bujumbura (Burundi)** *Africanews*. Former prime minister **Alain-Guillaume Bunyone** appears in court on charges of undermining national security and insulting the president;

28 Sep 2023 **Djibouti (Djibouti)** *Anadolu Agency.* A magnitude 4.9 earthquake hits Djibouti with no casualties reported but the education ministry closes all schools and vocational training centres in case of any aftershocks;

28 Sep 2023 **Kinshasa (DRC)** *The East African.* **United Nations Security Council (UNSC)** agrees to a proposal to fund the **East African Community Regional Force (EACRF)** which has been deployed in eastern DRC;

28 Sep 2023 **Addis Ababa (Ethiopia)** *AFP*. **United States (US)** secretary of state **Anthony Blinken** tells prime minister **Abiy Ahmed** that the US is increasingly worried about the situation in **Amhara** region where the **United Nations** claims human rights violations are taking place;

28 Sep 2023 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *The Africa Report*. **United Kingdom Export Finance (UKEF)** is delaying a \$121.9m payment for the development of the **Nairobi Railway City** after Kenyan authorities failed to award necessary contracts to developers;

28 Sep 2023 **Kampala (Uganda)** *Al Jazeera*. Local coalition **Convening for Equality (CFE)** reports that the enactment of the **Anti-Homosexuality Act (AHA)** in May has led to a wave of human rights abuses, mainly committed by private individuals who have been radicalised by the enactment of the law;

28 Sep 2023 **Kampala (Uganda)** *The East African*. Energy ministry official **Irene Bateebe** says Uganda is in final stage negotiations with **Chinese** financiers to help fund the **East African Crude Oil Pipeline (EACOP)**;
