- 10 Apr 2024 **Dar es Salaam (Tanzania)** *The Citizen*. According to the April 2024 edition of **Africa's Pulse**, the **World Bank**'s biannual survey of **African** economies, the **East African** subregion is projected to experience the fastest pace of economic growth in the **sub-Saharan Africa** region during 2024 and 2025;
- 9 Apr 2024 **Djibouti (Djibouti)** *Al Jazeera.* **International Organization for Migration (IOM)** confirms that at least 38 migrants and refugees died after their boat sank off the coast of Djibouti;
- 9 Apr 2024 **Djibouti (Djibouti)** *Capital FM.* The presidency names foreign affairs minister **Mahmoud Ali Youssouf** as its candidate for the position of **African Union Commission** chairperson;
- 9 Apr 2024 **Addis Ababa (Ethiopia)** *The Guardian.* Coffee growers report that the **European Union**'s **(EU)** new regulation that requires growers to prove their coffee did not come from deforested land requires a significant amount of technology and manpower that the growers do not have. Coffee is Ethiopia's largest export and the EU is its biggest market;
- 8 Apr 2024 **Kinshasa (DRC)** *Mining Weekly.* **Autorité de Régulation de la Sous-traitance dans le Secteur Privé (ARSP)** (regulatory authority for subcontracting in the private sector) announces a new agreement with **China**'s **CMOC Group** to ensure greater local participation in the value chain of the **Tenke Fungurume Mining** project;
- 9 Apr 2024 **Kigali (Rwanda)** *The Guardian.* President **Paul Kagame** meets with **United Kingdom** prime minister **Rishi Sunak** to discuss the planned policy that will see the UK deport migrants to Rwanda;
- 9 Apr 2024 **Kampala (Uganda)** *Business Day.* **European Union (EU)** announces it will grant Uganda, **Africa**'s largest coffee exporter, \$43m to help the country comply with a new EU policy that bans the import of commodities whose production resulted from forest destruction;
- 8 Apr 2024 **Dar es Salaam (Tanzania)** *Africanews.* **Southern African Development Community (SADC)** confirms that mortar fire killed three Tanzanian soldiers deployed as part of the SADC peacekeeping mission in eastern **Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC)**;
- 8 Apr 2024 **Dar es Salaam (Tanzania)** *China Global South Project.* **China** invites **Uganda**'s energy minister to **Beijing** to discuss the **East African** country's \$5 billion crude oil pipeline, connecting Uganda's western oilfields to Tanzania's **Tanga** port, a development that could signal a possible breakthrough in Uganda's efforts to woo Chinese financiers to fund the pipeline after Western banks declined after pressure from environmentalists;
- 7 Apr 2024 **Addis Ababa (Ethiopia)** *The East African.* **Ethiopian Securities Exchange** confirms it has raised the initial capital target of \$11.07m it needed to fund the start of operations;



- 7 Apr 2024 **Maputo (Mozambique)** *Club of Mozambique.* **Rwanda** says it will provide more soldiers to help battle insecurity in **Cabo Delgado** province following the upcoming withdrawal of the **Southern African Development Community Military Mission in Mozambique (SAMIM)** in July;
- 7 Apr 2024 **Kigali (Rwanda)** *Business Day.* **South Africa**'s President **Cyril Ramaphosa** says in a media briefing on his meeting with President **Paul Kagame** that relations between the two countries are improving;
- 7 Apr 2024 **Kigali (Rwanda)** *News24.* President **Paul Kagame** meets with **South Africa**'s President **Cyril Ramaphosa** and former South African president **Thabo Mbeki** to discuss the situation in eastern **Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC)**;
- 7 Apr 2024 **Kigali (Rwanda)** *France24.* Rwanda commemorates the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Rwandan genocide;
- 7 Apr 2024 **Zanzibar (Tanzania)** *Daily News.* **Zanzibar** president **Hussein Mwinyi** and the consul general of **Oman** in Zanzibar, Sheikh **Said Salim Al Sinawi**, commit to boosting the two countries' bilateral ties in various sectors, including health and education;
- 6 Apr 2024 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *France's* foreign affairs minister, **Stephane Sejourne**, arrives in Kenya as part of an **Africa** tour aimed at renewing ties with Africa;
- 5 Apr 2024 **Dodoma (Tanzania)** *Daily News.* The **United Kingdom (UK)** strengthens its commitment to Tanzania with the official opening of a new **British High Commission** office in **Dodoma**:
- 4 Apr 2024 **Addis Ababa (Ethiopia)** *News24.* **Somalia** expels Ethiopia's ambassador, **Muktar Mohamed Ware**, and recalls its own ambassador to Ethiopia, also ordering Ethiopia to close its consulate in **Somaliland** as tensions over the port deal between Somaliland and Ethiopia continue;
- 4 Apr 2024 **Dar es Salaam (Tanzania)** *The Citizen.* **Bank of Tanzania** (central bank) raises its key interest rate from 5.5% to 6%, citing lingering inflationary pressures;
- 3 Apr 2024 **Addis Ababa (Ethiopia)** *Reuters.* Ethiopia's official creditors have reportedly agreed to give the country until the end of June to conclude talks with the **International Monetary Fund (IMF)**:
- 3 Apr 2024 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *The East African.* **Central Bank of Kenya (CBK)** holds its benchmark lending rate at 13% to allow it to lower inflation levels further;
- 3 Apr 2024 **Kampala (Uganda)** *Africanews.* Constitutional court rejects a request to strike the country's controversial anti-LGBTQ law;
